Glossary of commonly used terms and acronyms | Papakupu

Activity class	A grouping of similar transport activities into 12 categories for which funding ranges are established as set out in the Government Policy Statement on Land Transport.
Approved organisations	Organisations eligible to receive funding from the NZ Transport Agency for land transport activities. Approved organisations are defined in the Land Transport Management Act 2003 as including regional councils, territorial authorities or a public organisation approved by the Governor General (by Order in Council).
BCA	<i>Business case approach</i>
DSI	<i>Deaths and serious injuries</i>
ECMT	<i>East Coast Main Trunk rail line</i> - Main rail line between Hamilton and Tauranga.
FAR	<i>Funding assistance rate</i> - When a land transport activity undertaken by a council or other approved organisation qualifies for funding from the NLTF the FAR determines the proportion of the approved costs of that activity that will be paid from the Fund.
Future Proof	Future Proof Strategic and Implementation Plan 2009. This strategy has been prepared and adopted by Hamilton City Council, Waikato District Council, Waipa District Council, Waikato Regional Council and tangata whenua with input from the NZ Transport Agency and other strategic partners.
GPS	<i>Government Policy Statement on Land Transport</i> - A government policy statement issued under section 66 of the Land Transport Management Act 2003 which sets out the Government's direction and funding priorities for 6 financial years.
HIF	<i>Housing infrastructure fund</i>
HPMVs	<i>High Productivity Motor Vehicles</i> - A longer or heavier (greater than 44 tonnes) truck that must travel on a specified route permitted by all relevant road controlling authorities.
IAF	NZ Transport Agency's draft investment assessment framework
ILM	<i>Investment logic mapping</i> - used as a tool under the Business Case Approach for reviewing this plan.
KPI	<i>Key performance indicator</i>
Local roads	Any road, other than a state highway. Local roads are under the control of a territorial authority.
Long Term Plan	The 10 year community plan (formerly known as the Long Term Council Community Plan) produced by regional and territorial authorities under the Local Government Act 2002.
LTMA	<i>Land Transport Management Act 2003</i> - The main statutory framework for land transport planning and funding in New Zealand.
NIMT	<i>North Island Main Trunk rail line</i> - Main rail line between Auckland and Wellington via Hamilton.
NLTF	<i>National Land Transport Fund</i> - A dedicated fund established under Part 2 of the Land Transport Management Act 2003 to pay for land transport activities.
NLTP	<i>National land transport programme</i>
NPS-UDC	<i>National Policy Statement - Urban Development Capacity</i>

NZTA/the Agency	<i>New Zealand Transport Agency</i>
ONRC	<i>One Network Road Classification - A national road classification developed by NZ Transport Agency and Local Government NZ and the Automobile Association and adopted for use nationally by all road controlling authorities.</i>
PGF	<i>Provincial Growth Fund</i>
RAG	<i>Regional Advisory Group - Technical staff from approved organisations and NZ Transport Agency that provide technical advice to the Regional Transport Committee on the preparation of the Plan.</i>
RCA	<i>Road Controlling Authority</i>
REG	<i>Regional Education Group</i>
RLTP/Plan	<i>Regional Land Transport Plan</i>
RPTP	<i>Regional Public Transport Plan 2015-2025</i>
RTC	<i>Regional Transport Committee - A Regional Transport Committee is established under section 13 of the LTMA to prepare, on the regional council's behalf, the regional land transport plan. The Committee has representation from Waikato Regional Council, territorial authorities within the region, and the NZ Transport Agency.</i>
SH	<i>State Highway - A road managed by the NZ Transport Agency.</i>
TAIP	<i>NZ Transport Agency's draft Transport Agency Investment Proposal 2018-27 (replaces former State Highway Investment Proposal).</i>
TLA	<i>Territorial Local Authorities</i>
UNISA	<i>Upper North Island Strategic Alliance - Established in 2011, UNISA responds to and manages a range of inter regional and inter metropolitan issues, including transport. Members consists of Northland, Waikato and Bay of Plenty Regional Councils, Auckland Council, Whangarei District Council and Hamilton and Tauranga City Councils. Mayors and Chairs from the respective regions make up the alliance.</i>
VKT	<i>Vehicle Kilometres Travelled - A measure of the distance travelled by all vehicles measured along a selected route or within a geographic area.</i>
WRRSF	<i>Waikato Regional Road Safety Forum (previously Regional Road safety Steering Group (RRSSG) - A multi-agency group which oversees regional road safety direction in the Waikato.</i>
WRRSS	<i>Waikato Regional Road Safety Strategy 2017-2021 - Developed by Waikato Regional Council in agreement with the Waikato Regional Road Safety Forum. The Strategy is approved by the Regional Transport Committee and adopted by the Waikato Regional Council as a key implementation tool for the delivery of road safety in the Waikato region.</i>
