## **WINTER WORKS 2020**

Waikato Regional Council has endeavoured to allow all sites to remain active due to the eight weeks of inactivity during the COVID-19 lockdown period and has been approving works on a month-by-month basis.

The Waikato has been fortunate to have had lovely weather for the beginning of winter. However, as the wet end of the season approaches it is paramount that all erosion and sediment controls are well maintained to prevent discharges. We recommend that large areas of bulk earthworks and/or inadequately stabilised areas should be restricted and staged to reduce the overall risk, and entrance ways must be well maintained. Please ensure that you apply for winter works at least 10 days before the start of a month to give us enough time to process your winter works approvals and prevent unnecessary delays.

On a positive note, to date no enforcement has been undertaken on any consented civil sites. Keep up the good work and maybe we can make it through this winter unscathed!




Figure 1: Sediment discharge due to inadequate stabilisation of site entranceway.
